

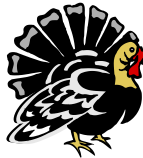

Parenting Information

Thankfulness

Use these tips to foster thankfulness in your child.

Talk with your child about things that you and he/she are happy to have. People you are happy to know and situations that you are happy have happened.

Teach your child to say, "Thank You" in appropriate situations.

Explain why it is important to say, "Thank you" - emphasizing the consideration of other people's feelings.
